**Albertalli, B.    Yes No Maybe So**

Jamie Goldberg, who chokes when speaking to strangers, and Maya Rehrman, who is having the worst Ramadan ever, are paired to knock on doors and ask for votes for the local state senate candidate and unexpectedly fall in love.

**Blake K.        Three Dark Crowns**

On the island of Fennbirn, triplet sisters who each wield a coveted magic skill and claim an equal right to the throne must fight to the death when they turn sixteen for the title of Queen Crowned.

**Brown, R.        A Song of Wraiths and Ruin**

Malik, a refugee desperate to save his sister, and Karina, a grieving crowned princess with a mission, vow to destroy each other even as a mutual attraction builds between the two.

**Charbonneau, J.    Time Bomb**

Trapped in their school after a bomb goes off, six students fight to survive and when they discover that someone inside is the bomber, they are also looking for who among them is the culprit.

**Cohn, R.         Dash & Lily's Book of Dares**

Told in alternating voices of Dash and Lily, two sixteen-year-olds carry on a wintry scavenger hunt at Christmas-time in New York, neither knowing who—or what — they will find.

**Dugan, J.         Verona Comics**

Told in two voices, cellist Jubilee and anxiety-ridden Ridley meet at a comic con where both of their families have booths, and begin a relationship they must hide from their parents.

**Green, J.         Will Grayson, Will Grayson**

When two teens, one gay and one straight, meet accidentally and discover that they share the same name, their lives become intertwined as one begins dating the other's best friend, who produces a play revealing his relationship with them both.

**Fulton, V.        Horror Hotel**

Chrissy has always been able to see ghosts, and when her friend Chase realized it, he turned her affliction into an internet sensation, with the help of Emmaline, the tech expert, and Kiki, the presenter; now they are planning to film an episode in an infamously haunted hotel in Los Angeles, but they may be tackling something really dangerous because Chrissy is seeing the terrifying shadow man who started appearing to her when her mother was dying of cancer—and there's an internet troll who keeps sending death threats to the group.

**Hand, C.         My Lady Jane**

On the eve of her marriage to a stranger, sixteen-year-old Lady Jane Grey is swept into a conspiracy to usurp the throne from her cousin, King Edward.

**Latham, J.        Dreamland Burning**

When Rowan finds a skeleton on her family's property, investigating the brutal, century-old murder leads to painful discoveries about the past involving a teen and the Tulsa race riot in 1921.

**Langley, A.       Hurricane: Perspectives on Storm Disasters**

What is it like to witness a hurricane? Tis book looks at Hurricane Sandy and other major

storms, using firsthand accounts to describe events and people's experiences providing multiple perspectives from eyewitnesses, survivors, the emergency services, scientists and the media.

**McManus, K. One of Us Is Lying**

When the creator of a high school gossip app mysteriously dies in front of four high-profile students, all four become suspects. It's up to them to solve the case.

**Nazemian, A. The Chandler Legacies**

Brought together through the Circle, a coveted writing group where life-changing friendships are born and secrets are revealed, five students at an elite boarding school challenge the long-standing culture of abuse through their writing.

**Nelson, J. I'll Give You the Sun**

A story of first love and family loss follows the estrangement between daredevil Jude and her loner twin brother, Noah, as a result of a mysterious event brought to light by a beautiful, broken boy and a new mentor.

**Ness, P. Burn**

Sarah's family hires a dragon to work on their farm, a last resort for poor families, but when she notices her dragon acting erratically, she uncovers a prophecy linking her to a deadly assassin, a dragon-worshipping cult and two FBI agents.

**Nijkamp, M. This Is Where it Ends**

Minutes after the principal of Opportunity High School in Alabama finishes her speech welcoming the student body to a new semester, they discover that the auditorium doors will not open and someone starts shooting as four

teens, each with a personal reason to fear the shooter tell the tale from separate perspectives.

**Park, L. A Long Walk to Water**

When the Sudanese civil war reaches his village in 1985, eleven year old Salva becomes separated from his family and must walk with other Dinka tribe members through southern Sudan, Ethiopia, and Kenya in search of safe haven. Based on the life of Salva Dut, who, after emigrating to America in 1996, began a project to dig water wells in Sudan.

**Reynolds, J. All American Boys**

When sixteen-year-old Rashad is mistakenly accused of stealing, classmate Quinn witnesses his brutal beating at the hands of a police officer who happens to be the older brother of his best friend.

**Schumacher, A. Full Flight**

Told in alternating perspectives, in a small town in Texas, mellophone player Weston Ryan and saxophonist Anna James are forced to work together on a duet for their school's marching band competition.

**Sepetys, R. Salt to the Sea**

Racing to freedom with thousands of other refugees as Russian forces close in on their homes in East Prussia, Joana, Emilia and Florian meet aboard the doomed Wilhelm Gustloff and are forced to trust each other in order to survive.

**Shusterman, N. Scythe**

In a world where disease has been eliminated, the only way to die is to be randomly killed ('gleaned') by professional reapers ('scythes').

Two teens must compete with each other to become a scythe—a position neither of them wants. The one who becomes a scythe must kill the one who doesn't.

**Silvera, A. Infinity Son**

Manifesting supernatural phoenix fire abilities when he turns 18, Emil becomes a reluctant defender against the specters that overshadow his world and reluctantly joins a vigilante team that his powerless brother, Brighton, idolizes.

**Stiefvater, M. The Scorpio Races**

Nineteen-year-old returning champion Sean Kendrick competes against Puck Connolly, the first girl ever to ride in the annual Scorpio Races, both trying to keep hold of their dangerous water horses long enough to make it to the finish line.

**Summers, C. Sadie**

Resolving to bring her sister's killer to justice, an orphaned teen goes missing while investigating meager clues, before a radio personality learns her story and becomes obsessed with finding her before it is too late.

**Tamari, L. All the Things We Never Knew**

Carli and Rex have an immediate connection but family secrets, disappointments—and basketball, which holds center stage in both their lives—creates complications.
