OUR CONSTRUCTION PROJECT is coming to a close.

Throughout the period of construction we have worked to have minimal closings so as not to impact too much upon our community's use of their library resources. We so far have had two one-week closings (in February and March), which were necessary to install our library's new fire-safety sprinkler system.

There will be two more one-week closings, necessary for the installation of carpeting and also for when we break down the walls that separate our new additions from the main library. We thank you for your patience during this period, and trust that you will enjoy your new, expanded library facilities upon completion in October.

Library materials charged out prior to the dates closed will have extended due dates, so that no library materials will be due during the times when the library is closed for construction.


