LIBRARY JOURNAL CENTER MORICHES FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES 5 STAR RATING BY LIBRARY JOURNAL FOR 6TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR!

The Center Moriches Library is among 7 libraries in Suffolk County to have received a Five Star rating from Library Journal, the oldest and most respected publication in the field. Of the 260 Star Libraries, only 85 have received a five star rating nationally. Library Journal star ratings are based on each library's number of annual patron visits, circulation, public access computer use, and program attendance. Star Library ratings of five, four, and three stars are awarded to libraries that generate the highest combined per capita outputs among their spending peers. This data is reported each year by public libraries to their state library agencies and is compiled on a national level by the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

NEW COMPUTERS FOR YOUNG ADULTS

The Library is proud to announce the addition of four new computer workstations located in the Teen Services Department. They feature Dell 17" Windows 10 laptop computers. Each is loaded with the most widely used productivity software suite, Microsoft Office, with Access and Powerpoint, Microsoft Publisher, as well as iTunes and more!

Of course the Internet is there with links to great research products, accessible from the Library's homepage. Be sure to give them a try. There is the popular genealogy product **Ancestry.com** for family research and JSTOR Scholarly Journal Articles for serious researchers. (Both must be accessed from in the Library.) Others like those included in **Live-brary**, Suffolk Library's online collection may be used from any computer inside or outside the library. Resources that may be of particular interest to young adults include:

- Brainfuse, which provides access to live tutors in math, science, reading/ writing, social studies, PSAT/SAT, ACT, AP and state standardized tests. Also includes a 24-hour online writing lab and Homework Question Center.
- Career Cruising, an online career guidance and planning system where you can prepare for the SAT/ACT, find a career, build a portfolio, learn how to write a resume and search for jobs.
- Historic and current newspapers including the NY Times, Newsday and the **Wall Street Journal** as well as several other periodical databases.

It's good to know that there is a wealth of electronic information available to students through the library that is current and can be trusted for it's accuracy and authority.

History buffs and ordinary citizens alike will learn a lot about their past and may get the "warm-fuzzy's" while researching our local history collection located in the Adult Reference Area next to the Reference Desk.

A fun place to start your journey would be to thumb through Mary and Van Field's ever popular Illustrated History of the Moriches Bay Area which includes local history and is filled with captioned pictures of notable buildings and locations. Then there's Phil Trypuc's Collection of **Old Pho**tos of the Center Moriches Area (see image above). This wonderful collection can be viewed in it's entirety in the library. Some pictures have been posted online and are available via Flickr by clicking the link on the left hand column of the library's web site.

At the heart of the collection is the microfilmed collection of the *Moriches* Bay Tide, Moriches Bay View and the Center Moriches Record going back as far as 1928! Indexes for these papers can be found by clicking on the brown "Local & Historic Newspapers" icon found towards the bottom of the homepage. 



It is located on land once part of Mitchel Air Force Base which, together with nearby Roosevelt Field and other airfields on the Hempstead Plains, was the site of many historic flights. Many seminal flights occurred in the area. By the mid-1920s the cluster of airfields was dubbed the "Cradle of Aviation", the origin of the museum's name.



GEORGE L. WYBENGA ARTIST, EDUCATOR, LIBRARY PATRON

The Center Moriches community and the library has lost a good friend. His pleasant demeanor and generous nature was well known in the Center Moriches neighborhood since moving here back in 1970. Notably, he has recently been honorord for donating platelets more than 300 times. Also, the beautifully carved guilded wooden sign on the library's front lawn was created and donated by Mr. Wynenga.

George was born in Delft, the Netherlands in 1937 and emmigrated to the United States in 1956. Shortly after his arrival, he served in the United States Army for three years and then went on to complete his education in graphic and packaging design, earning a BFA degree from the prestigeous Pratt Institute followed by a master's degree in art education from Hunter College.

Goerge volunteered with the Pratt Youth Corps giving elementary students a taste of making art which led to his employment in the Islip school district, and subsequently at Suffolk Community College, Long Island University and the Parsons School of Design. He finally arrived at the Fashion Institute of Technology in Manhattan where he and a colleague authored *The Packaging Designers' Book of Patterns*, initially published by Van Nostrand Reinhold, now by John Wiley and Sons. (You can check it out of the library or download it at Live-brary Free Downloads.)

George's philosphy was to enjoy life and he found great personal satisfaction studying and painting rairoad cabooses. There are 265 watercolors of cabooses which he would exhibit at train shows and now has posted on the web. See these wonderful paintings at www.cabooseart.com.
