## LIBRARY BUDGET VOTE TUESDAY, APRIL 17TH, 2018.

Residents of the Center Moriches Union Free School District are asked to vote on the Library's budget on Tuesday, April 17th, 1:30-8:30pm in the Children's Activity Room. A public hearing on the proposed Library budget will be held in Meeting Room A on Monday, April 9th at 7:00pm. Copies of the proposed budget for the Library's 2018-19 fiscal year will be available at the Circulation Desk two weeks before the voting date.

Residents of the contracting school districts East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk will be asked to vote on their Library Proposition on Tuesday, May 15th at the polling places and times for their respective school district budget votes.

**Please note!** The Annual Library Proposition for East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk is to determine whether residents of these contracting districts desire public library service to their communities for the upcoming fiscal year, from a choice of public libraries serving their respective districts. If you reside in one of these contracting districts, it is very important that you vote on your Annual Library Proposition.



## LIBRARY JOURNAL LIBRARY CENTER MORICHES FREE PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES 5 STAR RATING BY LIBRARY JOURNAL FOR 7TH CONSECUTIVE YEAR!

The Center Moriches Library is among 7 libraries in Suffolk County to have received a Five Star rating from Library Journal, the oldest and most respected publication in the field. Of the 259 Star Libraries only 85 have received a five star rating nationally. Library Journal star ratings are based on each library's number of annual patron visits, circulation, public access computer use, and program attendance. Star Library ratings of five, four, and three stars are awarded to libraries that generate the highest combined per capita outputs among their spending peers. This data is reported each year by public libraries to their state library agencies and is compiled on a national level by the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

## AMERICA'S BOATING COURSE CMA712

SATURDAY, APRIL 21ST, 9:30AM-5:00PM.

The United States Power and Sail Squadron, Moriches Bay, is offering America's Boating Course (ABC) at the Center Moriches Library. People completing the course and passing the end of course test will be given a boating safety certificate that they completed the course, and which satisfies New York State Safe Boating Education requirements. Persons born after May 1, 1996 are required to possess this certificate when operating a power boat. All persons, regardless of age, must complete a Boating Safety Course in order to operate a Personal Watercraft (Jet Ski/Wave Runner). However, operators of all boats, including sail, kayaks, canoes and paddleboards are encouraged to take the course.

**The cost of the ABC course is \$60. Family discounts are available.**

If the weather is bad, we will not have you standing on line outdoors. A security guard will let people inside the building to wait, **in the order that they arrived to stand on line**, and numbers will be handed out.



## **The Artist's World: Book Selections by Maurine R. Donnelly**

**Poetry In Person: Twenty-Five Years of Conversation with America's Poets**, edited by Alexander Neubauer (2010): Newly discovered recordings of visiting poets at the New School in Greenwich Village after the death in 2003 of Pearl London, the teacher who taught the series, "Meet Poets and Poetry." (811.608 Poetry)

**Dinner with Lenny: The Last Long Interview with Leonard Bernstein**, by Jonathan Cott (2013): This free-ranging conversation in 1989, lasting 12 hours between Cott and Lenny, was most unusual since Bernstein rarely gave interviews. (Biography Bernstein)

**Tom and Jack: The Intertwined Lives of Thomas Benton and Jackson Pollack**, by Henry Adams (2009): Beginning in New York City where Benton became Pollack's friend and teacher, the two artists later spent time together painting in Paris. All his life Pollack wanted the approval of Thomas Benton, a realist who was famous for the murals of working people. (759.13 Adams)

**Words Without Music**, by Philip Glass (2015): *Einstein on the Beach*, an opera by Glass in 1976, was the beginning of a world-wide acclamation and appreciation of his musical genius. He begins after he graduated from the University of Chicago in his teens, and relates the trips to Paris and India (where he learned from Ravi Shanker), tales of his friends and teachers, and the jobs he had (taxi driver, furniture mover) before his life in writing operas, concerts and music for films. (Biography Glass)

**Time To Be In Ernest: A Fragment of Autobiography**, by P.D. James (1999): Taking to heart the words of Samuel Johnson: "At seventy-seven, it is time to be in earnest," when James turned 77 she began to write, in the form of a diary, about her life and her inspirations for her books. (Biography James)

**Are You Experienced: How Psychedelic Consciousness Influences Modern Art**, by Ken Johnson (1988): Needed to absorb the art of the 1960s was "a heightened Zen-like state of attentiveness, a kind of receptivity to subtleties of time and space..." which Johnson goes on to explore. (709.0407 Johnson)

**Andrew Wyeth: A Secret Life**, by Richard Meryman (1966): Research details gathered by the author over 30 years make an absorbing life story of the acclaimed painter. Andrew's father, N.C. Wyeth was a well known illustrator who controlled his early life. (Biography Wyeth)

**A Piece of the World**, by Christina Baker Kline (2017): Getting to know Christina, the subject of the painting *Christina's World* by Andrew Wyeth, by reading the fictionalized account of her life is one of the most powerful, wrenching experiences one can enjoy. The author acknowledges as one of her sources the book by Meryman, *Andrew Wyeth: A Secret Life*. (Fiction Kline)

**Speak Memory: An Autobiography Revisited**, by Vladimir Nabokov (1966): Nabokov's memories of childhood include the fact that he saw colors associated with different letters and he had a natural genius in mathematics, which disappeared when he had pneumonia. His interest in butterflies began as a child and he became an authority in this field. The last scene in the book is when he, his wife Vera, and their son Dmitri are leaving for America in 1940. (818 Nabokov)

**The Secret History of Vladimir Nabokov**, by Andrea Pitzer (2013): Encoded into Nabokov's works are references to the tumults of the world he was carefully living in that held anti-Semitism, concentration camps, Russian tragedies and the World Wars. (Biography Nabokov)

**The Paper Garden: An Artist Begins Her Life's Work At 72**, by Molly Peacock (2010): The life of Mary Delaney, (1700-1788) who, after the death of her second husband, began working with paper and making flowers of indescribable delicacy and beauty. (Biography Delaney)
