FRIENDLY REMINDER **LIBRARY BUDGET VOTE** **TUESDAY, APRIL 17TH, 2018**

Residents of the Center Moriches Union Free School District are asked to vote on the Library's budget on Tuesday, April 17th, 1:30-8:30pm in the Children's Activity Room. A public hearing on the proposed Library budget will be held in Meeting Room A on Monday, April 9th at 7:00pm. Copies of the proposed budget for the Library's 2018-19 fiscal year will be available at the Circulation Desk two weeks before the voting date.

Residents of the contracting school districts East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk will be asked to vote on their Library Proposition on Tuesday, May 15th at the polling places and times for their respective school district budget votes.

Please note! The Annual Library Proposition for East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk is to determine whether residents of these contracting districts desire public library service to their communities for the upcoming fiscal year, from a choice of public libraries serving their respective districts. If you reside in one of these contracting districts, it is very important that you vote on your Annual Library Proposition.

BATTLE OF THE BOOKS CMY530 **GRADES SIXTH - NINTH**

The Suffolk County Battle of the Books program is an inter-library competition between teams of teens focused on 8 young adult novels. Teams can be no larger than 6 players (students entering grades 6-9 in the fall) but have been as small as 2 players. Held in August, the competition is divided into three back-to-back 4-hour Regional Competitions and an Awards Night. At the Regional Competition, each team gets to participate in 4 separate rounds. Each round covers 2 of the 8 books and each team is given 20 questions per round. Titles to be covered in each round are announced in advance but not specifically mentioned in the questions. At the Awards Night, the top scoring teams will compete for the County Championship.

Would you like to represent Center Moriches in this county-wide competition? Please join us on Saturday, June 2nd at 2:00pm. We will tell you the titles of the 8 books and chat about what it means to be on our team! Refreshments will be served.

PROGRAMS ARE FOR ADULTS ONLY, AND A CENTER MORICHES LIBRARY CARD IS REQUIRED, UNLESS ADVERTISED AS "ALL ARE WELCOME".

Saturday registration: Lines start forming before 9:30AM for the most popular programs, so it is advisable to arrive up to an hour early in order to secure a spot for yourself. If the weather is bad, we will not have you standing on line outdoors. A security guard will let people inside the building to wait, **in the order that they arrived to stand on line**, and numbers will be handed out.

Due to popularity, some programs may fill within the first hour of registration.

Registration online begins at 9:30AM.

Patrons may register **only one** additional cardholder when presenting all library cards at registration. Photocopies of library cards are acceptable, provided the photocopy shows the library card's barcode.

The Pluto Files: The Rise and Fall of America's Favorite Planet, by Neil deGrasse Tyson (2009): The International Astronomical Union officially voted, in 2006, that Pluto was no more considered a planet. Mr. Tyson explains why this decision was made. The Rose Center for Earth and Space in the Hayden Planetarium at the New York Museum of Natural History contains an exhibit explaining the reclassification of Pluto. (523.4922 TYS)


The Homing Instinct: Meaning & Mystery in Animal Migration, by Bernd Heinrich (2014): Opening a "window to the mysterious minds of animals," Heinrich explains cranes, bees, turtles, butterflies, moths, ants, termites, birds and others in their quest to return home (wherever that might be). We Are Our Brains: A Neurobiography of the Brain, from the Womb to Alzheimer's, by D.F. Swaab (2014): Explanation of brain development. Swaab says: "We come into the world with brains that are already unique, shaped by a combination of our genetic background ... in which our characteristics, talents and limitations are to a large extent already determined." (612.82 SWA)

Lab Girl, by Hope Jahren (2016): Jahren, winner of three Fulbright Awards in geobiology, tells how her early life was spent in her father's lab, then building three labs of her own in several universities. Her life was devoted to studying grasses, trees, and flowers with questions such as: Do trees recognize their own seeds? She has been called "a passionate geobiologist with the soul of a poet." (Biography Jahren)

The great interest in ghosts, séances and the occult seemed perfectly scientific because the mysterious wave in the air (electricity) seemed to allow speaking to the dead. Tesla, who had a lab for a short time in Colorado Springs, used the word "television" in 1900, after which Tesla returned to Long Island). The Card Catalog: Books, Cards and Library Treasures, by The Library of Congress (2017): Studied in college as Library Science, the organization of a book collection was the focus of Callimachus for the Library of Alexandria around 250 B.C. In 1782, James Madison saw the need for a library for the use of Congress and began the collection. After the British burned the library in the War of 1812, Congress bought Thomas Jefferson's library for \$23,950 to start a new library. The evolution of the card catalog and the digital online catalog is described. Notable books and their old Library of Congress catalog cards are shown.
