

Do you, or someone you know, have difficulty reading a regular print book? Individuals who utilize large print books, as

well as those who are unable to read regular print books due to visual impairment, physical disability, or read-




ing disability as diagnosed by a medical doctor, are eligible for the National Library Service (NLS) Talking Books program. Users enjoy access to thousands of audiobooks, free of charge, sent directly to their home or downloaded through the internet! Digital audio players are loaned to participants free of charge and there are never any fees or penalties.
