## Adult Registration GuideDUE

**DUE TO THE POPULARITY OF THE FOLLOWING CLASSES, programs are for adults only (16 years and above), and a Center Moriches Library Card is required, unless advertised as “All are Welcome”:**

**Saturday Registrations:** Lines start forming before 9:30am for the most popular programs, so it is advisable to arrive up

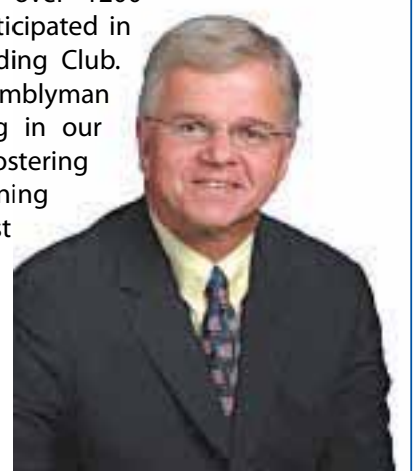
