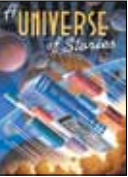


Library Proposition Vote

Each round covers 2 of the 8 books and each team is given 20 questions per round. Titles to be covered in each round are announced in advance but not specifically mentioned in the questions. At the Awards Night, the top scoring teams will compete for the County Championship.

DUE TO THE POPULARITY OF THE FOLLOWING CLASSES, programs are for adults only (16 years and above), and a Center Moriches Library Card is required, unless advertised as "All are Welcome".

Saturday Registrations: Lines start forming before 9:30 am for the most popular programs, so it is advisable to arrive up to an hour early in order to secure a spot for yourself. If the

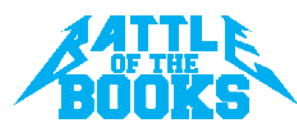

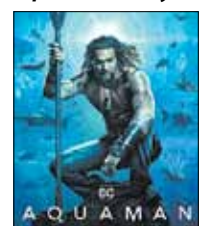
