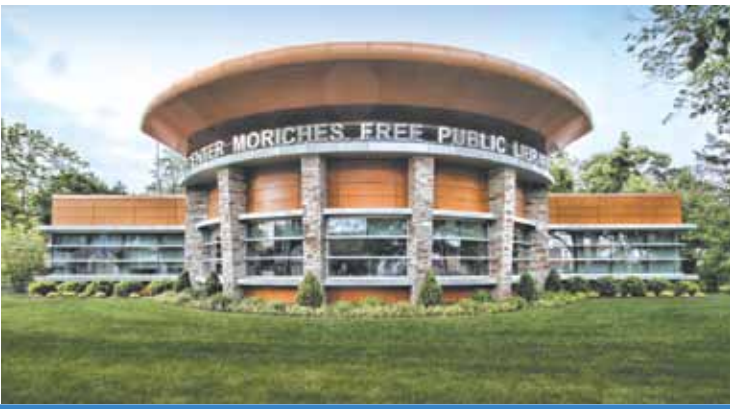

  - Current postmarked mail.
  - Current utility bill (cable, telephone, water, etc.).
  - Automobile registration or automobile insurance card.
  - Lease, Property Deed, Tax Bill, Mortgage statement.



**Fine Free**  
Beginning July 1, 2019 overdue fines will not be charged on items that are returned late with the exception of Museum Passes, New Items, Graphic Novels, Test Guides and items from our Library of Things (see page 8). Items that are returned damaged, are longer than six months overdue or items that have been lost will be assessed the full replacement cost of the item. Patrons who currently have existing fines on their library account from overdue items should speak to a Librarian. As a reminder, individual library cards with over \$5.00 in fees are stopped from borrowing materials and households with \$50.00 in fees stops borrowing privileges for the family. Overdue fines may still apply to items that are borrowed from other libraries.

## Adult Registration Guide

**DUE TO THE POPULARITY OF THE FOLLOWING CLASSES, programs are for adults only (16 years and above), and a Center Moriches Library Card is required, unless advertised as "All are Welcome".**

**Saturday Registrations:** Lines start forming before 9:30 am for the most popular programs, so it is advisable to arrive up to an hour early in order to secure a spot for yourself. If the

weather is bad, we will not have you standing on line outdoors. A security guard will let people inside the building to wait, **in the order that they arrived to stand on line**, and numbers will be handed out.

Due to popularity, some programs may fill within the first hour of registration.

Registration online begins at 9:30 am.

If you are more than ten minutes late to a class please call the library at 631-878-0940, otherwise your spot may be given to any standbys who are waiting.

Patrons may register only one additional cardholder when presenting all library cards at registration. Photocopies of library cards are acceptable, provided the photocopy shows the library card's barcode.

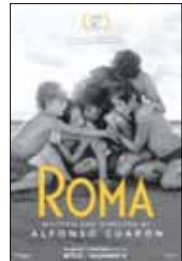

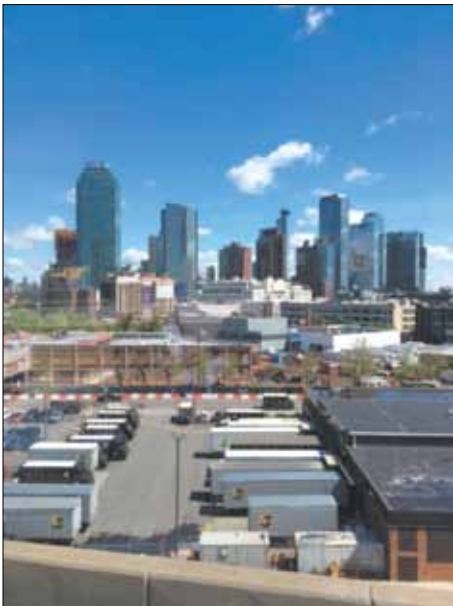
