



#### Dr. William A. Savino, Jr.

Dr. William A. Savino, Jr., passed away on July 30, 2019. To most people in Center Moriches, he was well-known and respected as the dentist on Main Street for over 50 years. He was still working there, along with his daughter Judith – who followed him into the profession – up until his death. He was also a proud U.S. Army veteran, having served his country in Vietnam.

Patrons of the library know that he was also a long-term member of the Library Board of Trust-
