IN THE SPOTLIGHT



WHY DID BUFFALO BILL DO THAT?

I read an absorbing novel, *The Heartsong of Charging Elk*, by James Welch, based on facts about the fate of an Indian left in Marseilles, France by Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show in 1899. The question, "Why would Buffalo Bill do that?" kept nagging at me. Asking Google led me to Ken Lopez, an antiquarian bookseller in Hadley, Massachusetts. One of his specialties is Native American authors and I called him. We had a most interesting conversation and I asked him my question. He said he had often wondered also and surmises that it was just part of the culture of the times - you survived if you kept your wits about you. It would not happen that way today.

Charging Elk had fallen ill with influenza, fell off his horse in the Wild West Show and was taken to a hospital. The show went on to the next town without him. He was given no information. There was no one to speak his language. It was only after Charging Elk decided on his own to escape the hospital and subsequently charged with vagrancy that the American Embassy was contacted. They were of no help and the hospital listed him as deceased as a result of mistaken identity. A newspaper man took up his cause and wrote about him during the next 5 or more years. A family who aimed to help those in need gave Charging Elk a home and a job. He learned the French language and as time went on he met the love of his life and began a family in France. In 1915, a new Wild West Show came to Marseilles which Charging Elk attended. But when offered an opportunity to return to America he declined because his life was now in France.

THE PRE-LOADED LEARNING TABLET





