Professional photographer Meryl Spiegel will teach you to take better digital photographs to capture your special moments. Concepts covered include; becoming familiar with your digital camera, focusing, lighting, creating harmony and balance, framing, creating movement, filling frames and how to look for and place shapes within photographs.

In this six week workshop, you'll work with a variety of subjects to improve your command of composition, still life, landscapes, people and animals. Class time will be followed by visits to local parks, or other local venues. There will be a weekly homework assignment and photos will be shared at the following class and critiqued within the group setting.

When completed on December 3rd, your work will be displayed as a library exhibition and a reception will be hosted to which the public will be invited. Students will have an opportunity to discuss their artwork with community members, family and friends and share their experience as to how and why they choose their subject matter and what they have learned.

REMEMBERING DIONNE LEVINE

LIBRARY BOARD MEMBER & EDUCATOR

A long-time resident of both East Moriches and Center Moriches, "Dee" (as she was known to her friends) lived in the area for more than 50 years. Education was the focus of her life. Along with three other women, she started the PTA in the East Moriches Schools. Ms. Levine not only taught in the Center Moriches Schools but also served on the Center Moriches Library's Board of Trustees for twenty-seven years. And being an Alumna of Alfred University, she was an alumni-elected Trustee from 1999-2002 and was awarded the Lillian Nevins Award, the highest honor bestowed by the Alfred University Alumni Association, in 2004.

Dionne Levine contributed much to our community. Her generosity has been well appreciated by her neighbors and she will be long remembered for years to come. We will all greatly miss her.

Saturday registration: Lines start forming before 9:30AM for the most popular programs, so it is advisable to arrive up to an hour early in order to secure a spot for yourself. If the weather is bad, we will not have you standing on line outdoors. A security guard will let people inside the building to wait, in the order that they arrived to stand on line, and numbers will be handed out.
