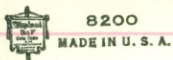

New Business

- 1. Discussion about Soc. Sec. and Mr. Rizzi. Mr. Donnelly said that Mr. Rizzi had written Albany concerning our employees and their Soc. Sec. problems and would report to us when he had received word.
- 2. Mr. Donnelly reported that the Little League of Cen Mor would hold a back issues magazine sale in the Library during Nat. Lib Week, April 25-30, 1966. Proceeds of sale would go to "Save the Little League Fund".
- 3. Miss Eastman, of the N Y State Dept. of Ed, legal dept. wrote the Library concerning centralization of new school districts, Miss Eastman quoted the following in this letter: " Under the provisions of Section 1804 of the Education Law(subdivision (subdivision5b) in the case of a centralization formed after July 1, 1964, the central school district succeeds to the property rights of all of the school districts included in the central district, and the bonded indebtedness of such districts becomes a charge upon the central school district. This change in the former law was made by Chapter 554 of the laws of 1964."

The above quote answers the Board's inquiry concerning which district, the former or the newly formed on, would be responsible for the payment of a bond issue entered into by the old district.

Dear Mr. Donnelly:

This is in response to your letter concerning the proposal to build a school district public library.

As I understand it, the Center Moriches public library was established by School District No. 33 of the Town of Brookhaven. The present proposal is that the new library building be financed by bond issue of that school district.

You ask, in the event that the school district were to be reorganized and become part of a central school district, assuming that the aforesaid bond issue was outstanding, whether that school district would be required to continue to pay the debt service on this bond issue or whether the bond issue would become the obligation of the central school district.

Under the provisions of Section 1804 of the Education Law (subdivision 5b) in the case of a centralization formed after July 1, 1964, the central school district succeeds to
