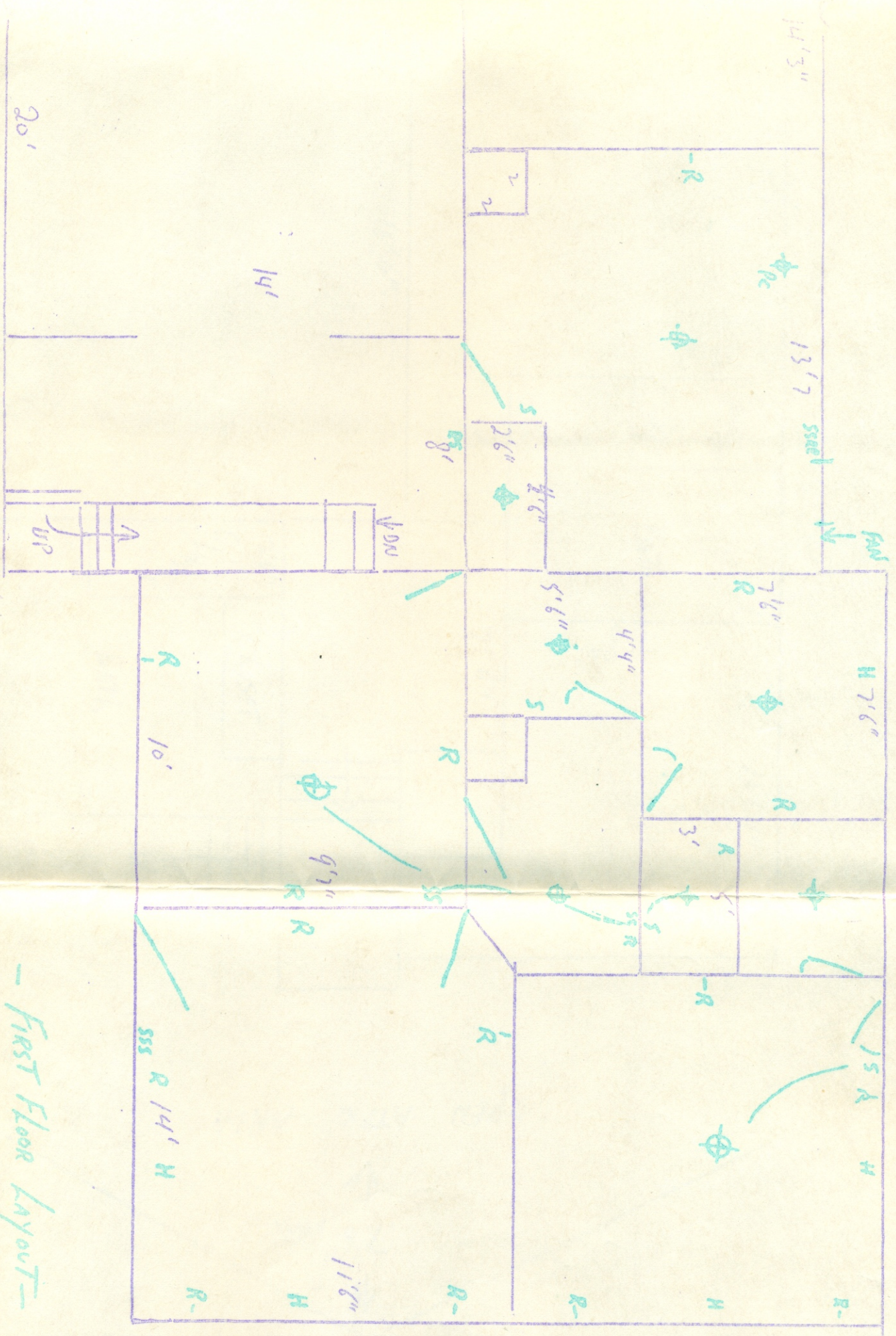
Proposed Changes Of Library Building

Comments:

1. The problems involved and solutions I suggest are similar to the recent renovation job at the Sunrise. I understand that is to be done by local men.
2. Your present ceiling height of 8 feet can be dropped to allow fish plating and a drop center beam as required.
3. Present ceilings on first floor would be lost, but after that, any partition or all partitions could be removed.
4. Changes in wiring and plumbing can be concealed in ceiling drop and boxed posts.
5. For practical reasons, present wiring would be largely scrapped if fluorescent lighting is planned.

2 STORY → ← 1/2 STORY



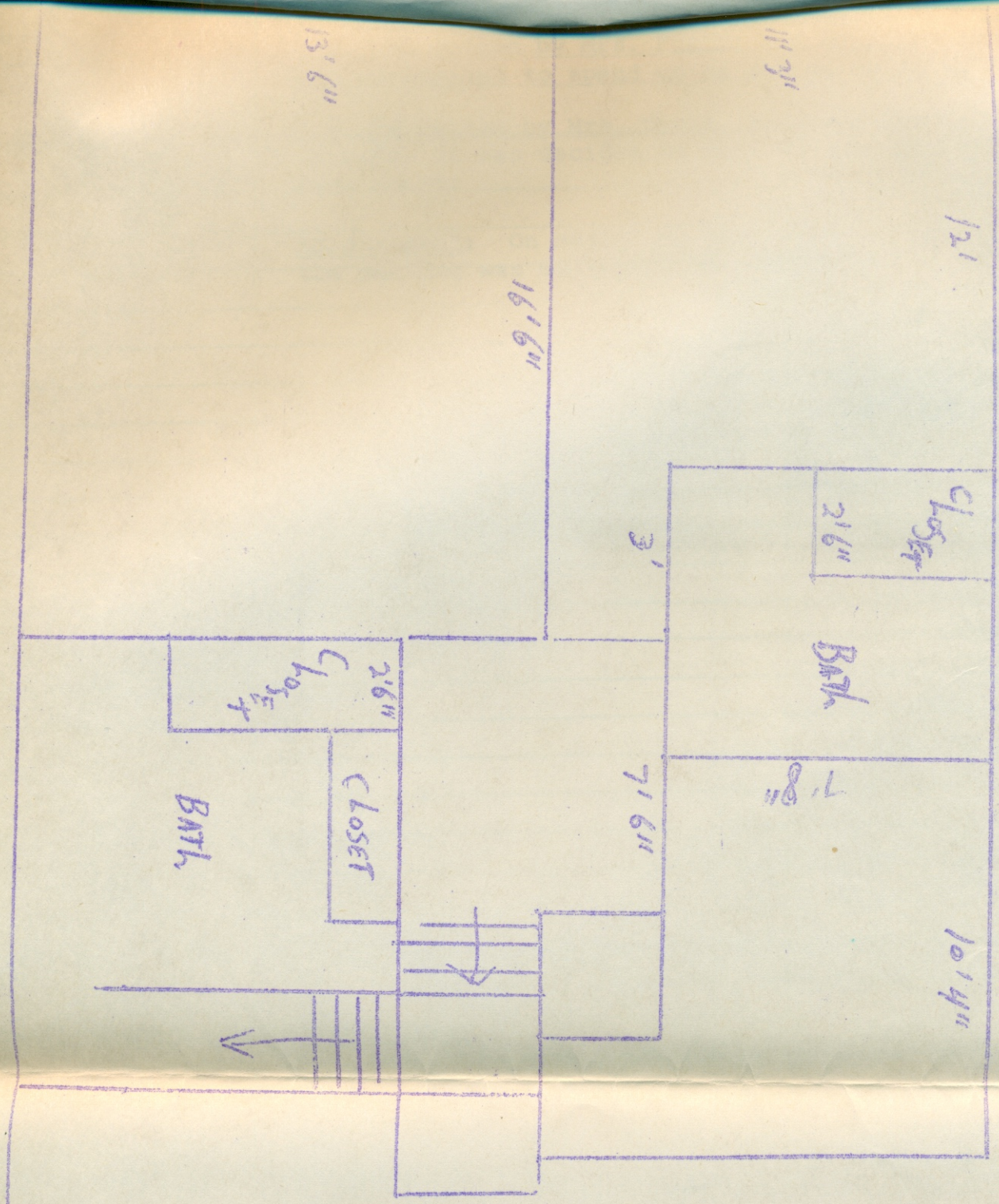
CELLAR → ← CRAWL
