3. Circulation: It was reported that the circulation for the
month of January 1958 was 963 as compared with 1106 for January 1959.

4. A discussion of the hours that the library is open was held.
It is felt that possibly, with a group of volunteers, the library
could be open every evening in the week.


5. A letter from the Board of Education was read concerning

Gentlemen:

At the regular monthly meeting of the Center Moriches Board of Education held last Friday, February 6, 1959, the following matters were discussed in regard to the public library and it was voted to bring them to your attention.

1 - As yet we have not received an answer to our letter regarding social security.

2 - It seems quite likely that New York State Income taxes will be withheld from salaries beginning this year. The Board would like to know whether or not the law is being fulfilled in that a report is made to the Federal Government yearly stating how much salary is paid each employee.

3 - The budget is in the process of being compiled for the next school year. It would be desirable if the Board of Trustees would discuss its budget for next year and inform the Board of Education what is necessary to be raised by tax for the library. Perhaps, a committee from the Board of Trustees could come to the next meeting of the Board of Education and discuss various matters pertaining to the budget and upkeep of the library building.
