Library Proposition Vote

Residents of the contracting school districts East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk will be asked to vote on their Library Proposition on Tuesday, June 9 by absentee ballot with their respective school district budget votes.

Please note! The Annual Library Proposition for East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk is to determine whether residents of these contracting districts desire public library service to their communities for the upcoming fiscal year, from a choice of public libraries serving their respective districts. If you reside in one of these contracting districts, it is very important that you vote on your Annual Library Proposition.

2020 Census

It's not too late to participate in the 2020 census! The self-response deadline has been extended to October 31, 2020. When you respond to the questionnaire, you'll help your community get the proper share of over \$675 billion in federal funds that are spent on programs such as schools, hospitals, roads and other vital programs. If you have not yet responded online, field operations are planned to resume on June 1, 2020.

2020 Election Information

The New York State Primary Election has been delayed until June 23, 2020. As per Governor Cuomo, this election will be conducted through mail and all registered voters will be sent an application for an absentee ballot, postage paid. Simply return the application by mail to receive your absentee ballot. SCAM ALERT!

Scammers are looking to take advantage of you during the COVID-19 outbreak. These are the latest scams to look out for:

• Medicare scams - these scammers may call offering a "COVID-19 kit," "Coronavirus package" or Medicare benefits related to the coronavirus. They will pretend to be Medicare representatives but will ask you to verify personal information such as your bank account number, your Social Security number or your Medicare number. If anyone on the phone asks for this type of information, they are NOT a Medicare representative and this is a scam.

• Relief payment scams - these scammers use calls, texts and emails to pretend to be from various government agencies (ie: the IRS, Social Security Administration, Census, USCIS or FDIC). They may say the recipient has been approved for money, can get quick relief cash payments or cash grants due to the coronavirus. They may also promise small business loans or send alerts that a check is ready to be picked up.

None of these are from a government agency, and anyone who responds to them will be asked to verify personal information or send money to receive benefits.

• Some scammers are attempting to gain access to the coronavirus stimulus checks. These scammers will ask for your bank account information, PayPal account information or Social Security number saying you need to "sign up" to receive your check. Please be aware that if you filed taxes in 2018 or 2019 the government already has the information it needs to send your stimulus check. If you did not file taxes recently, please visit <https://www.irs.gov/coronavirus-tax-relief-and-economic-impact-payments> to ensure they have what they need.

• Be on the lookout for emails claiming to be from the Center for Disease Control or the World Health Organization. These will often come with links purporting to be instructions to protect yourself but will actually infect your computer with malware.

• Before donating to any charity claiming to provide aid to those affected by the coronavirus, do some research to ensure they are legitimate, as there are many fake charities seeking to capitalize on the crisis. Please visit <https://www.consumer.ftc.gov/features/how-donate-wisely-and-avoid-charity-scams> for more information about how to determine which charities are real or not. Remember if a charity asks you to donate via cash, gift card or by wiring money, they are likely a false charity.

• Fake emails claiming to be coronavirus instructions from the White House, asking recipients to click a link for more information, but will instead redirect to a page to download, which will download malware onto your computer.

• Fake emails from a hospital claiming to inform people that a member of their staff has been infected. This also came with a link to download, which infected the recipients' computers with malware. Similar fake emails instructed recipients to download a spreadsheet to take to the doctor's office, which then downloaded malware onto their computer.

Library Information

At the time of publication the library remains closed under the Governor's Executive Orders. Librarians are available to assist with reference questions, book recommendations, technology assistance and other services by calling the library Monday-Saturday between the hours of 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. You can also chat with a librarian on our website Monday-Friday between the hours of 4:00 pm to 7:00 pm. As a reminder, book drops are open for returns and there will be no late fines on any items that are currently checked out. We are currently not accepting book donations at this time. Fake email offers with refunds for canceled flights. These emails contained a link with a form asking for personal information such as their phone number, email address and credit/debit card number.

Fake emails claiming to be from one's employer pretending to give access to a document about "COVID-19 Employee Benefits." These emails will then ask for your work login and credentials to defraud the company.

There have been reports of individuals knocking on doors pretending to inform people that one of their neighbors has contracted the virus, only to force entry and rob the homeowner. Similar scams have involved people claiming to be Red Cross volunteers doing home testing.

Emails claiming to be from the US Treasury releasing "unclaimed ATM card to curtail the recession," asking for a \$50 fee.

Text messages claiming to be from the Department of Health and Human Services instructing recipients to click on a link to take a "mandatory online COVID-19 test." There is no way to test for COVID-19 online and the link asks for the recipients' personal, medical and financial information.

Fake emails claiming to be from the Small Business Association, purporting to provide individuals with an application number so they could apply for a "small business grant." By clicking the attached form, the recipients' computer became infected with malware.

Some scammers are creating fake pop-up testing centers, charging a fee to "test" passersby.

Fake Facebook messages telling recipients to fill out the 2020 Census or they will not receive their stimulus checks. The 2020 US Census has nothing to do with the rollout of the stimulus checks.

Fake calls claiming to be from the CDC offering to let people reserve COVID-19 vaccines, before asking for the recipients' Social Security Number. There is no vaccine for COVID-19 as of yet.

Some fake calls about the coronavirus include:

• Offers of fake tests for Medicare recipients

• Offers to have free tests sent to your home

• Offers of free sanitation supplies

• Special health insurance plan offers

• Offers to refinance due to low mortgage rates

• Fake orders to suspend your Social Security number

• Offers to ensure that small business are listed correctly on Google

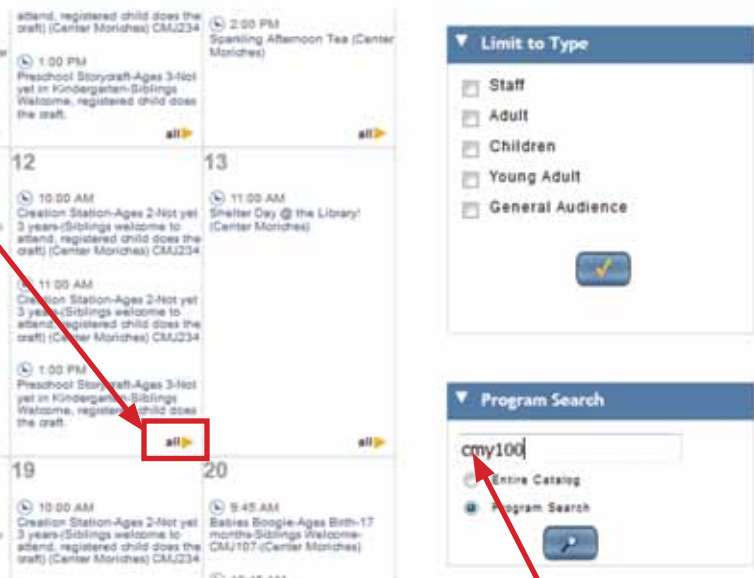

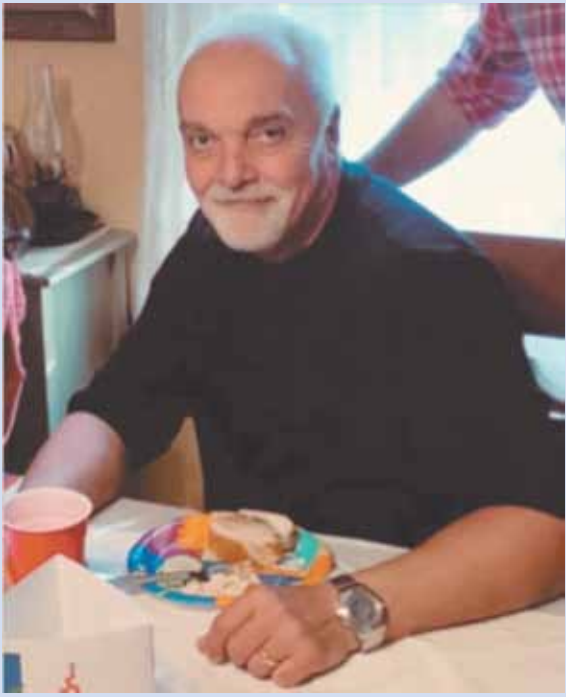

## Mortgage Relief

The Federal Coronavirus Aid Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) offers protection for holders of federal mortgages during this time of financial hardship. The two major protections offered in the plan are

- Mortgage forbearance, allowing holders of federal mortgages to pause or reduce mortgage payments for up to 180 days during the crisis. If you are granted forbearance, you will not incur late fees, have delinquencies reported to credit reporting companies and foreclosure and other legal proceedings will be suspended.
- Moratoriums on foreclosures if the holder is unable to pay, for 60 days after March 18, 2020.

These options will work differently depending on who your mortgage servicer is, whether your mortgage is federally backed, and on which federal agency backs your federal mortgage. The best way to determine what you qualify for is to contact your mortgage servicer directly to find out who backs your mortgage and discuss your options.

If you are renting from a landlord who has a federally backed mortgage, your landlord may not evict you for nonpayment of rent for a period of 120 days, beginning March 27, 2020. Once that period is finished, your landlord must provide you with a thirty-day notice to vacate before eviction.

In addition, New York State requires all that state-regulated institutions grant all forbearance applications on any residential mortgage of a property in New York to any individual residing in New York who demonstrates financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak. Please note this only applies to residential mortgages, not commercial mortgages or out-of-state residents, and also does not apply to federally-backed mortgages, which are covered by the CARES Act.
