


Atkins, W. The Immeasurable World

A sixth of the earth's surface is classified as desert. In the classic literary travel tradition of Atkins pens a rich and exquisitely


written account of travels in six deserts on five continents that evoke the timeless allure of these remote and forbidding places.

Published posthumously, this is a guide to some of the world's most fascinating places, as seen and experienced by writer,


television host, and relentlessly curious traveler Anthony Bourdain.



Eimer, D. The Emperor Far Away: Travels at the Edge of China


Beyond Beijing, China's lesser-known border regions in the West of the country are full of

Feiler, B. Walking the Bible: A Journey by Land through the Five Books of Moses



In May 2018, intrepid globetrotter Michael Palin spent






Theroux, P. Deep South: Four Seasons on Back Roads


The acclaimed travel writer explores the paradoxes and culture of America's Deep South, describing his four-season rural


Wilkinson, T. The Nile
