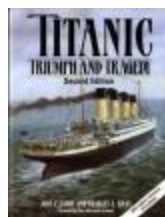


Biel, S. *Down with the Old Canoe*

Jessop, V. *Titanic Survivor*

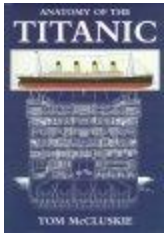
and sank during WWI. But this book is much more: a unique eyewitness account on history's most written about sea disaster.

A series of misfortunes have plagued the *Titanic's* passengers from the moment they set sail: mysterious disappearances, sudden deaths. Suspended in a

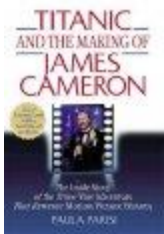
twilight zone during the liner's famed maiden voyage, the passengers are convinced that something sinister is going on. And then, as everyone knows, disaster strikes.

Titanic remains a monumental achievement in film. This fascinating book recounts the making of this modern classic

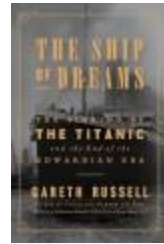
motion picture from conception to completion, offering a detailed, behind-the-scenes look at its stars, its crew, and James Cameron himself.
