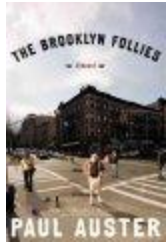




Antler, J. *The Journey Home*

This collection profiles female Jewish leaders who played key roles in American social and political movements, from suffrage to civil rights to fair

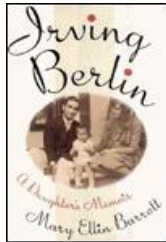
labor practices.

Carlin, P. *Homeward Bound: The Life of Paul Simon*



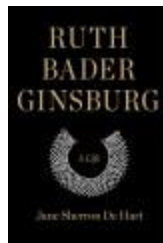
This biography details the life of the music icon, from his youth as a grandchild of Jewish Hungarian immigrants to the music that earned him 15 Grammy Awards.

De Hart, J. *Ruth Bader Ginsburg: A Life*

One of the most profoundly transformative legal minds of our time; at the heart of Ginsburg's story was her Jewish

background and the injunction to "repair the world," with its profound meaning for a young girl who grew up during the Holocaust and World War II.



Doctorow, E. *Ragtime*

Opening in 1906 at the home of an affluent American family, when the famous escape artist Harry Houdini swerves his car into a telephone pole outside

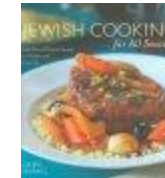
their house, the line between fantasy & history then disappears, as famous figures of the time cross paths with the fictional family.

This cookbook collects more than 150 creative kosher dishes.

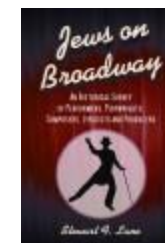
From everyday meals to holiday favorites, this book celebrates Jewish cooking with recipes that use fresh, seasonal ingredients.

Blending recipes with Rabinowitz family stories and illustrated with more than 500 family pictures, *Cooking*

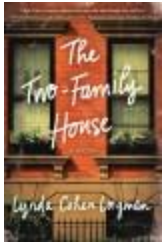
Jewish invites the reader into the kitchen, and also into a vibrant world of family and friends.

Jews have lived on Long Island since the 18th century, gradually flourishing in local business and politics despite periods of threat, until Long Island became home to a thriving modern Jewish community.

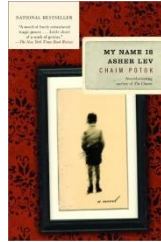
Morris, M. Gateway to the Moon



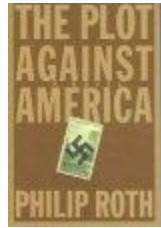
