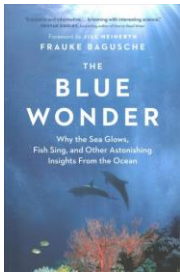


A Long Petal of the Sea

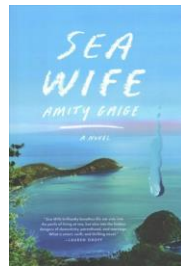

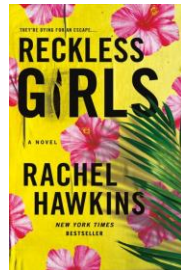
romance rises with the tide, they discover that it's never too late to chart a new course.

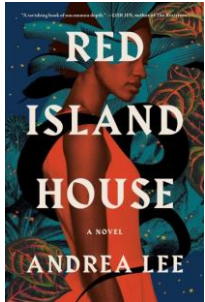
they explore the Islands together, she soon finds the line between loathing and liking thinner than a postcard.

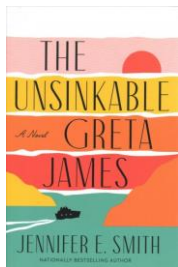

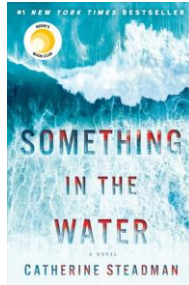
time with the enigmatic Piper--but he has no idea out of all the lives he's about to upend, it's his that will change the most.

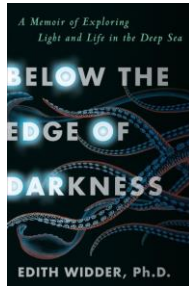
her confidence, she meets a charming historian on board.

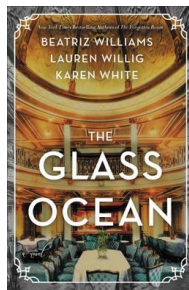
Suddenly the newlyweds must make a dangerous choice: to speak out or to protect their secret.
