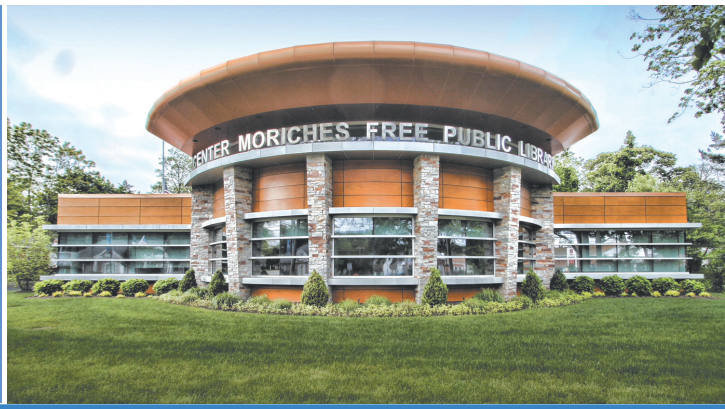

NEW Opening Hours

Expanded Library Hours

The Library will be changing its hours and will be opening earlier at 9:00 am, Monday through Saturday. This change takes effect on Tuesday, September 6th. We hope this makes using your library more convenient!

Library Upgrades

During the Summer the Library created a separate area for public computers, faxing and scanning and anticipate the installation of new tables in this area shortly. We are also in the midst of converting from oil heat to natural gas that will be more efficient, cleaner and save money. The final portion of our upgrade will rotate the stacks to create wider aisles that will be accessible and offer a better line of vision for security. New energy efficient lighting will also be installed. During the stack rotation, the library will be closed to the public. It is estimated to take 4-5 days to complete this project. Once the project is ready to proceed, we will notify patrons on our website and in our weekly e-newsletter.

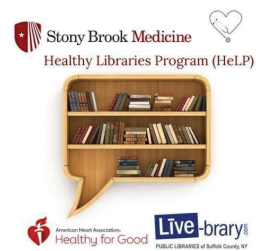

The Healthy Libraries Program (HeLP)

consists of students who are currently training in the fields of social work, public health, library science, and nursing, who are available at the library to provide blood pressure screenings, and to answer questions and provide

reliable, evidence based information on a wide variety of health topics such as heart disease, diabetes, understanding medications and much more. Students are also available to direct patrons to community resources, help fill out paperwork for social services, find housing, and assist with finding a healthcare provider and scheduling appointments.

Stony Brook Medicine's Healthy Libraries Program (HeLP) is a partnership with the Public Libraries of Suffolk County, the Suffolk Cooperative Library System Outreach Services Department, and is supported in part by the American Heart Association of Long Island. The HeLP program will be at our library on September 20th, October 18th and November 1st from 2-4:30. No appointment is necessary and all are welcome.



Paper Shredding, E-Waste and Drug Take Back Event

Saturday, October 15 from 9:00 am – 1:00 pm

The Town of Brookhaven and Councilman Dan Panico are sponsoring the E-Waste, Paper Shredding and Drug Take Back event to safely dispose of unused electronic devices, have your old paper documents securely shredded and to safely dispose of old prescription drugs.

Guidelines

- We advise residents only send one person per household.
- Residents disposing of e-waste will not need to leave their cars. They should clearly label what is e-waste and what is not, and the recycling crew will remove it from their trunks/cars.
- Residents looking to shred paper will be asked to place their documents in a bin next to the shred trucks.
