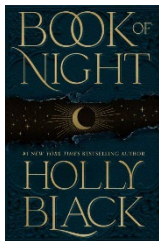

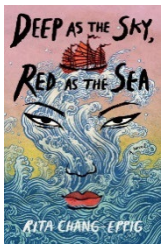

by Holly Black

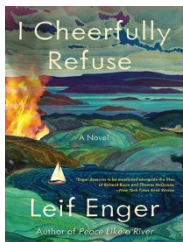

Deep as the Sky, Red as the Sea

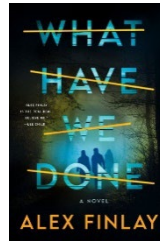

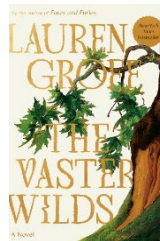
What Have We Done

A stay-at-home mom with a past. A has-been rock star with a habit. A reality TV producer with a debt. Three disparate lives. One deadly secret.



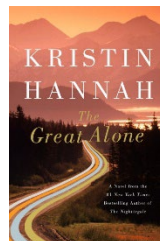
One Step Too Far

Running out of time and up against the worst man and nature have to offer, Frankie and the search party will discover what evil awaits those who go one step too far.



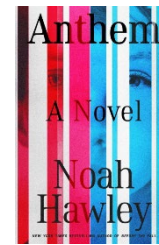
The Vaster Wilds

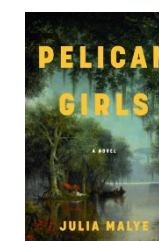
The Dead Take the A Train

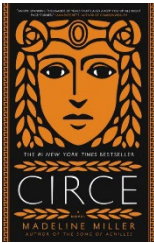
The Couples Trip

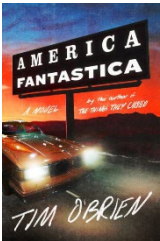
Pelican Girls

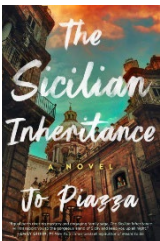


Circe

to choose between the worlds of the gods and mortals.

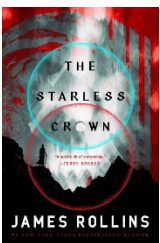


America Fantastica

Surviving Medieval England, except his copy exploded during transit.

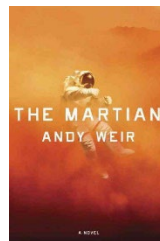


You'll Thank Me for This

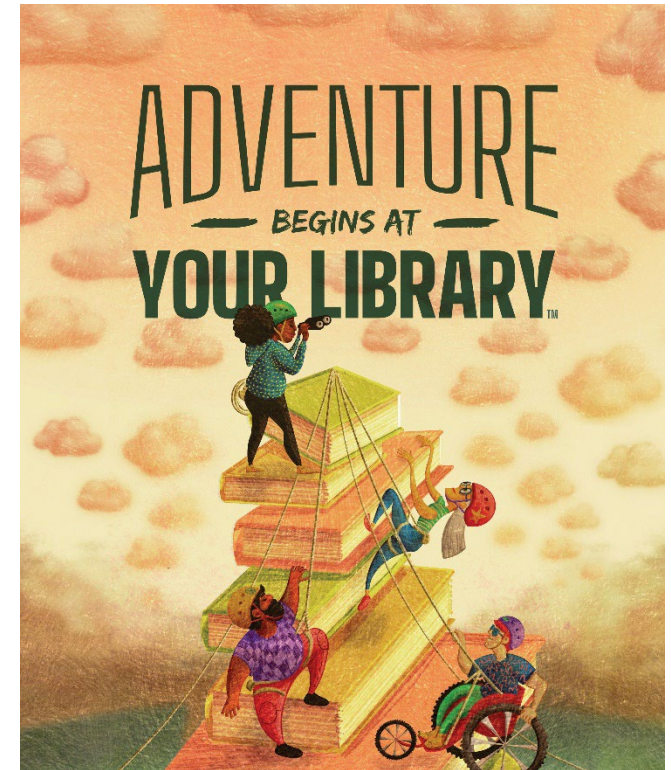
The Drift
