LIBRARY BUDGET AND TRUSTEE VOTE

Tuesday, April 14, 2026

Residents of the Center Moriches Union Free School are asked to vote on the library's budget and trustee position on Tuesday, April 14th, 10:00 am – 8:00 pm in the Community Room. A public hearing on the proposed Library budget will be held in the Community Room on Tuesday, March 31st at 6:30 pm. Copies of the proposed budget for the library's 2026-2027 fiscal year will be available at the Circulation Desk two weeks before the voting date and online at www.centermoricheslibrary.org.

Residents of the contracting school districts East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk will be asked to vote on their Library Proposition on Tuesday, May 19 at the polling places and times for their respective school district budget votes. Please note, the Annual Library Proposition for East Moriches, Eastport-South Manor, and Remsenburg-Speonk is to determine whether residents of these contracting districts desire public library service to their communities for the upcoming fiscal year, from a choice of public libraries serving their respective districts. If you reside in one of these contracting districts, it is very important that you vote on your Annual Library Proposition.

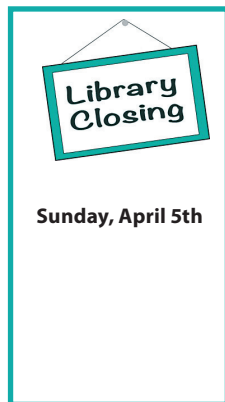

BOARD OF ELECTIONS: INTRODUCING NEW VOTING MACHINES

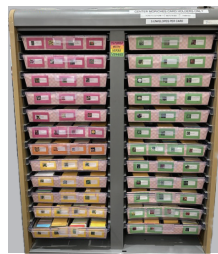
